- mirror the responsibilities of Essex County Human Service Sub-Committee (children's issues; foster care; public assistance and income support; services for senior and people with disabilities; immigration policy; social services) (Office for the Aging; Community Services Board and County Mental Health; Public Health)
- participate as working group on the Jay Comprehensive Plan Update (services across the generations)
- issues of the Adirondack Community Action Program (ACAP) Human Services Coalition (over two dozen service organizations, public, non-profit and private)
- 4) <u>Jay Comprehensive Plan Update</u> (Led by Wally W and Robin L):
- description of plan update intent, timeline and role of HS committee as a working group
- -- joining four other working groups; plan will allow for public involvement in town's future across 10-15 year timeline, basis for future town board decisions
- -- initial task: use judgement and results of public engagements (Open House [Oct 2024], Community Survey [Oct-Dec 2024], others) to identify 'focal topics,' issues and opportunities
- -- each working group should identify 3-5 focal topics for study based on criteria: public concern, impact of subject, extent of alternatives & town authorities, relative complexity (requiring research, debate and significant treatment in the comprehensive plan update)
- Robin L examined the inputs and proposed the following as possible focal topics:
- -- 1) Affordable Housing options for all populations and ages, including housing rehabilitation and housing of Seniors on Main St. near services, Services to keep Seniors in their homes.
- -- 2) Child Care and Day Care
- -- 3) Expanding Health Services in the Town to include doctors and pharmacy.
- -- 4) Blight within the Town
- -- 5) Dependable low-cost transportation
- -- 6) Substance Abuse issues
- -- 7) Recreational Activities for Youth
- 5) Town Supervisor Matt Stanley Remarks and Discussion (Led by Matt S and Robin L):
- important new committee for town and comprehensive plan
- thank you to Robin L for volunteering to champion the committee
- many opportunities to work on, including examples: senior transportation, toys for tots, food bank, office of the aging programs, senior lunches, meals on wheels
- useful to interview seniors; perhaps at a senior lunch (some attract up to 60 persons)

- useful to learn what other towns do
- identification of town intent within the comprehensive plan important to acquiring NYS grants

6) <u>Topical Discussions</u> (Led by Robin L):

- Affordable Housing:
- -- Robin L discussed NYS Housing Renewal Program with Teresa Cheatam-Palin (Chair of Keene Housing Task Force)
 - --- difficult to access and get donated properties
- --- money comes from NYS Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program; enables housing based on a percentage of income
 - -- Matt S described the Land Bank program
 - --- properties from tax foreclosures
- --- a property in Upper Jay recently had \$350K invested; sold for \$150K to new owners with restrictions as affordable housing, including on resales and having to pay taxes based on fair market value
- --- has potential for some, but legal and other complexities, e.g., tax delinquent party right to all money in sale above amount of delinquency according to recent US Supreme Court decision
 - -- Senior Housing funding grant program exists for housing near groceries/post office etc.
- Childcare & Daycare:
- -- need to learn about the needs and rules
- Substance Abuse:
 - -- currently have an Alcoholics Anonymous which meets twice weekly
- -- need to learn more about county programs
- -- no Narcotics Anonymous program locally
- Youth Recreation:
- -- Library Children's Summer Program (8-12 yo ?) has low attendance
- -- MS: it would be good to pull together what's out there and spread the word (e.g., the High School has many good programs; HS student member can help with this)
- -- Youth Commission: works with Black Brook for sports and some school programs
- -- JEMS has varied programs too
