Audience Comment:

Robin Licari and Lynn Ladieu addressed the Board regarding inadequate cellular service within the town. A petition containing 444 resident signatures was formally presented requesting exploration of infrastructure solutions. Supervisor Stanley noted previous action at the county level and town level seeking accountability from telecommunications providers and affirmed continued efforts. The FCC has not been involved at all.

Department Heads:

Water & Wastewater Superintendent Paul Mintz:

- Replaced the old fire hydrant at 1288 Route 9N and we moved it to a safer location away from a garage
- An extension for the hydrant was needed due to a change in grade and this cost just under \$1,400
- W-1 needs new tires and we will more than likely source them from Warren Tire under state contract for around \$1,150 split between the districts
- We have installed reflective markers at the Village Green at each sprinkler head along the perimeter, we hope this will avoid damage to them while removing snow up there
- We have been documenting all of the taps and any underground work we have been completing. If we don't have a map to do this on we have been taking pictures of the area to document on. We are completing a database of these on a google drive
- All parks and facilities that we maintain have been winterized
- We are looking to send Dan to a "B" water operator class, unfortunately our program of choice has lost their instructor. We will be keeping our eyes open for a future class.
- Down the road we will be looking to send Trevor Karl to a grade one wastewater class and grade "C" class so he can get those licenses as well

Highway Superintendent Chris Sorrell:

• Due to a problem with a section of Green Street (about a mile long) when it was paved, it needs to be milled and repaved. A lengthy discussion occurred on the best approach to correct this. The quote from Jointa Lime under county contract is \$90,000 to correct this.

- The J-15 case loader needs a new set of forks, after a brief discussion occurred, this was tabled until another time to allow for more quotes to be obtained
- The J-21 needed an emergency repair at Charlebois to replace the radiator

- We are in the process of getting all the equipment winter weather ready for the season
- An update on the Grove Road project was provided
- The highway is back to their regular winter work schedule
- Last storm updates were provided

Committees:

Economic Development update by Supervisor Stanley: There wasn't a meeting this month, but there is an update on our Microenterprise Grant that is being administered through the Essex County IDA. There will be a couple of applications going to the grant review committee. A resolution is needed so that the Essex County IDA can help the small businesses see their money faster. Essex County IDA would fund it and then be reimbursed by us when we get the grant money. The next Economic Development meeting will be November 19th.

Youth Commission update by Supervisor Stanley: Basketball signups are occurring now and soccer is now over.

Parks and Open Spaces Committee update by Councilor Dwyer: Our last meeting was held at the end of October. Some brush hogging has been occurring at the FEMA property in Upper Jay and it's starting to look nice and tidy up there. With the shutdown over we should be receiving some communication from the EPA on our Recreation Economy for Rural Communities technical assistance program. The Town of Jay was one of 25 communities selected nationally to participate in this program. Councilor Dwyer shared what this means with more updates to come. Another topic of discussion has been a dog park for the Town of Jay. Sarah Duheme and Larry Hartson have really taken on the initiative for this and possible sites for it have been being explored. Our spring volunteer day is currently being planned for Saturday, April 25, 2026. Our next parks meeting is November 20th. A brief discussion occurred on a water table for the children's park.

Climate Smart Task Force update by Councilman Sauer: Solar panels at the Highway Garage are waiting on Frontier to do hook ups so NYSEG can do their part. The community center had their site visit and energy audit last week. We hope to have their report next month to see what energy efficient improvements we can make. A discussion occurred on the compost pilot program grant and the 8 quotes that were received. A discussion on the costs to taxpayers at the end of the program occurred. There is a 25% match component to this grant.

Human Services Committee update by Robin Licari: Information was provided on the Essex County Suicide Prevention Team 5K that is on June 7th in the Town of Jay. We are continuing to look at opportunities for childcare in town and the area of expanding healthcare. We are collaborating with Mercy Care as well. We are working with the Upper Jay Art Center to do an event in February or March. A lengthy discussion occurred on the newly opened food bank that is located at the St James Episcopal Church in Au Sable Forks. There are currently 14 volunteers and we are working on new outdoor lighting and getting the word out that we are open.

The Board provided thanks for the new food bank, all they have done and all they have to offer. A discussion occurred on if some emergency food funds should be held back. The Red Cross or food bank volunteers could use the town site to prepare or provide food in the event of an emergency so funds would not need to be held back. The community can reach out to Robin if needed when the food bank is not open.

Comprehensive Plan Special Board update by Wally Walters: Since the last meeting the results of survey number two have been posted on the website. An arts and culture community focus working group survey that was conducted in September has also been posted. The work that is being completed now by the committee and consultant was shared. The next meeting will be November 17th. We are looking for some students to join our committees.

Supervisors Report:

• An email was received from Rob Fountain wanting to use the Community Center for an Arts in the Forks Festival on September 5th for Labor Day weekend. A contract would have to be signed and insurance will be required. This will be the first time they have had this festival.

- Chris Dresser reached out to see if the AuSable Bandits can use the community center gym once a week for offseason summer softball workouts. This has been tabled for now.
- The AuSable Theater in collaboration with JEMS is requesting the use of the Community Center gym for its 4th annual Drag Christmas Special on Sunday December 28th. This event will be a fundraiser for both entities. This is due to renovations occurring at the theater and at JEMS.

- Grove Road Update-The road will be open by December 1st and ready to go. There are two prepays for this to approve tonight
